
DR. S.SUNDER

Foundation for the Rehabilitation Education and Empowerment of the Disabled of Madras (FREEDOM TRUST) was founded in the year 1997 to cater to the needs of the physically challenged in terms of their mobility and livelihood by Dr. Sunder, a renowned rehabilitation specialist.

The main objective of the trust is to provide mobility aids like wheelchairs, tricycles, artificial limbs and orthoses to the economically rural physically challenged. Over theyears the foundation has distributed mobility aids and appliances to nearly **32,000** physically challenged and have conducted nearly **1000** rural camps across India.

In the last two years we have marched across the country, providing artificial limbs and mobility aids to rural physically challenged, even in remote inaccessible areas in Tamilnadu, Maharashtra, Kerala, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Assam, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Andhra Pradesh and Odisha.

CONDITION OF PATIENTS IN RURAL AREAS

Persons with locomotor handicap need mobility aids to mainstream themselves in society. Some need wheelchairs, others need calipers, and some need artificial limbs. Those in rural areas cannot afford to come to the city or towns where qualified rehabilitation teams are situated; they neglect their handicap and later develop deformities which are difficult to correct, except by surgical means. Persons in rural areas have hardly any access to crutches, wheelchairs and tricycles which enable them to move from one place to another. Mobility is very important; to make a child go to school, to enable a student travel to college, and to make a worker go to office.

OUR PROJECT



GRAM VIKALANG PUNARJANMAM Freedom Trust has been relentlessly working for the cause of such physically challenged persons and has helped them with mobility aids. **We give mobility which** is a fundamental need.

Patients with residual polio or cerebral palsy need orthoses, or calipers, which are custom made appliances given to paralyzed or weak limbs fit to the patients, enabling them to walk erect. An orthosis is a mechanical device fitted to the body to maintain it in an anatomical or functional position. Each mobility aid is custom made to the beneficiaries and the process ensure accurate fitment.



WALK INDIA making rural amputees walk...

Among the various types of physical disabilities, people with lower limb amputation benefit the most when fitted with prosthesis [artificial limb]. An artificial limb is essential to make an amputee get back to his life and resume his work independently. A sizeable number of physically handicapped are amputees.

It is our long-term vision to make people with lower limb amputation across India to get back on their feet with appropriate customized prostheses.

Freedom Trust conducts special camps for limb fitting at various towns and villages all over India and enables the amputees to walk with their newly fitted limbs.



SISHUPUNARJANMAM

Sishupunarjanmam refers to giving a fresh lease of life to differently abled, exceptionally talented children in the fields of music and arts. Launched in 2003, the project has enabled chosen students to establish a career for themselves in their respective fields. The scheme of providing scholarships and training has been so successful that five differently abled scholars have bagged the Most Creative Individual Award in the field of arts from the President of India

CAMP PROCESS

Field Visit

Each project begins with field visits by our field coordinators. A local organizer in the village or town is identified, usually an NGO or a voluntary association working in the field of disability. The need from the local physically challenged community is identified through them and data of persons needing appliances is collected before conducting the camp. A venue for organizing the camp in the same village or town which will be easily accessible and has disabled friendly amenities is chosen.



On the day of the camp, a team consisting of a Physiatrist [doctor trained in physical medicine and rehabilitation], a physiotherapist, and prosthetic/orthotic engineers visit the venue where the disabled persons are assembled. Usually, the numbers of persons assessed ranges from 50 to 200 per day. The Physiatrist assesses every beneficiary; and based on the physical condition, socio-economic background and condition of the existing appliances used by the beneficiary, a suitable mobility aid is prescribed.

Measurement Camp

Following the prescription of the appliances by the doctor, the beneficiary is moved to the orthotist-prosthetist section in the camp venue where appropriate measurement for the orthosis is taken by professionals.

Trial & Gait Training

A trial camp is conducted on the day of the camp or a day before it. The prosthetic team trains the beneficiaries on how to wear the device and maintain it. It is a training given to the users of artificial limbs to walk with their new limb. Such training is a vital factor in prosthesis fitment that will help the beneficiary use the appliance properly.

Distribution

Distribution of the appliances is done at a function in the town or village where the measurements were taken. The appliances are given away free of cost to the respective beneficiaries. The function usually involves the sponsor for the camp, team from Freedom trust, local organizer and the beneficiaries of the camp.



He is Kamlesh living in Thiruvarur. He was not able to go to school after right leg amputation. Feeling stressed, did not speak to anyone and was always dependent on his father and close family members.





