Digital Frauds in India: A Growing Threat.

India's digital revolution has brought unmatched convenience and connectivity, but it has also led to a dramatic increase in cyber frauds. With the widespread use of online banking, UPI transactions, and mobile apps; cybercriminals are finding new and sophisticated ways to exploit users, particularly vulnerable groups such as senior citizens. Among the rising threats are digital arrest scams and fraudulent investment schemes, both of which have become alarmingly common.





Various types of banking frauds have surfaced across the country. One of the most widespread methods is phishing and smishing, where fraudsters send fake emails or text messages pretending to be from banks or government agencies, tricking users into revealing account details or clicking on harmful links. SIM swap frauds involve obtaining duplicate SIM cards using stolen identity proofs, allowing scammers to intercept OTPs and access bank accounts. Fake loan and banking apps, often downloaded from unverified sources, closely resemble legitimate platforms but are designed to steal sensitive financial data. UPI and QR code frauds have also seen a sharp rise, with scammers manipulating victims into scanning QR codes under the pretense of receiving money, which actually results in unauthorized money transfers.

One the distressing and psychologically most manipulative scams is the digital arrest fraud. In this scam, a victim often an elderly person is contacted by a fraudster pretending to be an official from a government agency like the Customs, CBI, or local police. The caller accuses the victim of involvement in criminal activities such as money laundering or drug trafficking. To make the threat seem real, they use forged documents, spoofed caller IDs, and even video calls. Victims are pressured to stay on long calls and are emotionally manipulated until they agree to transfer large amounts of money to avoid immediate "arrest."

Digital Frauds in India: A Growing Threat.

Investment scams have also become prevalent, especially on social media platforms and messaging apps. Fraudsters pose as financial advisors or investors and offer lucrative returns on crypto currencies, stock trading, or international investments. They often start by providing small, quick returns to gain trust, only to later persuade victims to invest more, after which they disappear or cut off all communication. These scams are designed to target people unfamiliar with modern investment tools, making senior citizens an easy target.





To protect individuals especially senior citizens, it is essential to build a strong foundation of digital awareness. Regular training and information sessions should be organized by banks, community centers, and resident welfare associations to educate older adults on basic cyber safety practices. They should be reminded never to share OTPs or account details and to verify the identity of anyone requesting money or personal information. Banks must take responsibility by sending simplified fraud alerts in regional languages via SMS, recorded calls, or pamphlets. Dedicated helpline should be set up to assist seniors with digital services and fraud reporting. User-friendly banking apps with built-in fraud protection and easy navigation can also help safeguard elderly customers.



Visually impaired since birth, her journey began during her school days at Little Flower Convent Higher Secondary School for the Blind, Chennai. It was here that Freedom Trust, under its unique initiative Shishu Punar Janmam, identified her musical potential and offered her a pathway into formal training—planting the first seeds of her artistic journey.





Akshaya began her vocal training under the nurturing guidance of Smt. Usha Bharadwaj, who instilled the foundational discipline and bhava in her music. Later, her pursuit of excellence led her to train under Kalaimamani Dr. S. Sunder, whose scholarly mentorship helped her elevate her artistry. Simultaneously, she began learning the violin under Shri V.L. Kumar, mastering the instrument with as much dedication as her vocal practice

Despite being a school topper in Classes 10 and 12, Akshaya chose to follow her musical passion full-time. She completed her B.A. (Music) with distinction at Queen Mary's College and earned a Gold Medal in M.A. (Music) from the University of Madras (2016–2018). She also qualified for the National Eligibility Test (NET) with Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) and received the CCRT Scholarship, reflecting her academic and artistic prowess.
